The Renewal in India

Our Annual Fraternity Conference held this year from August 2 to 7 in Ipswich, Massachusetts was universally declared a most worthwhile experience for all those who attended from throughout the United States and the world. The next series of articles in our Visitation Newsletter will be based on the presentations that were made by the members of the Board. They may well be used by the local Fraternities as teachings at the regularly scheduled meetings.

One of the most encouraging aspects of our gathering were the accounts given by some of the international members. The growth and enthusiastic support that the Fraternity vision, and in fact the Renewal and the Gospel vision, is receiving in these parts of the world prompted one of the brothers to say "After hearing this I felt that this story was taken directly out of the Acts of the Apostles." The following article is part of the presentation given by Fr. Frances Dabre from the Diocese of Vasai, which was recently created from the Archdiocese of Mumbai (Bombay).

An elderly priest recently told me, "After I joined the Renewal my

priestly life has become very satisfactory." Renewal is a real need for the priests of India at this time. Many of our lay faithful are getting deeply involved in the Renewal. They go to many places for retreats and faith formation and as a result they are very much enlightened and well informed on the up-to-date teaching of the Church. The willing involvement of many priests and bishops is a true boost to these faithful.

Today in India we are happy to see many of our priests getting more and more involved in renewal activities. Many are doing their annual retreat in the charismatic style. It is a good sign for Mother Church that a large number of priests are getting fully involved. They give testimony of their experiences at public gatherings and in their homilies. This becomes evident in the experiential way they celebrate the Eucharist.

Through my participation in a Renewal Retreat the Eucharistic celebration became a very powerful experience with healings. It was the same Eucharist and the same prayers that I have often celebrated, but the movement of the Spirit was so powerful. It got rooted in the hearts of many of the concelebrants so that many have now decided to be part of the parish prayer groups instead of

being just onlookers. This gives tremendous boost to the people so that the number of those attending increases fast.

Earlier we priests were correcting them from afar but today, as part of the prayer group, we can correct any theological misinterpretation. There are leadership tensions in prayer groups at times and with strong spiritual leadership of a priest present the misguided ideas of some Pentecostals can be corrected on the spot.

Monthly celebrations of the Eucharist have become a real source of POWER for our prayer groups. As we gather to give praise and worship to the Lord, the choirs play an important role. However, silence is also needed especially after receiving Holy Communion. The presence of the living God can be experienced in silence.

I am being invited to celebrate Mass in the charismatic style. Keeping all the laws of the Liturgy it is still possible to be creative and make a celebration very lively and different from the routine. Leading our faithful people in praise and worship experiencing with them the inner joy and peace of silence has helped my to enjoy the Eucharist at a deeper level.



If someone is sick or going for surgery many now call me and ask for prayer. If I am able to, I will go and visit them, lay hands on them knowing that the Lord works very mightily. I have experienced a new power in my priesthood. Having personally seen the healing power of the Spirit has caused me to take some steps to improve my personal life. Because of our involvement in the Renewal the people know whom they can call on for prayer. Our presence in these prayer groups gives confidence to the leaders and the people. I find fulfillment personally in this new way of being a priest.

At one time I too was an onlooker of the Renewal. I did just the minimum. I would show up to expose the Blessed Sacrament and at the end go back to give benediction. I was hesitant to trust in the power of God and lift my hands in prayer and get involved. Today I am deeply part of the whole process and this has given me great satisfaction and much inner peace.

We priests know that we are already anointed and called by our Lord. There are many ways to get to know about Jesus, but my taking part in the Renewal and gathering with other priests to pray and share our lives lets us experience Jesus and be filled with the Holy Spirit as were Mother Mary and the Apostles at Pentecost. One of the ways we are experiencing another Pentecost in India is in our Charismatic Prayer Groups and the Fraternity of Priests.
